Our most ambitious new program was a full-year after school theater program at St Martin de Porres Academy in New Haven. Square Foot Theatre's Patrick Laffin met with students weekly with the first half of the year focused on building basic theatre skills such as improvisation, voice projection, body language, as well as exploring the more personal realm of emotional expression and emotional self-regulation. The second half of the year involved applying those skills to produce the school's first musical theater production - *Godspell, Jr.* Many of the teachers in the audience were brought to tears, "You just can't imagine what a personal triumph it is for these kids to have dedicated so much positive energy into this project given the personal challenges some of them are dealing with in their daily lives."

2015 Scholarships & Legacy Awards

This year three very talented individuals were chosen by the Amity High School teaching staff to receive our four-year partial scholarships in Studio Art and in Theater Arts. The recipient of the Studio Art Scholarship, Cynthia Celone,

Cynthia will be attending Lyme Academy College of Fine Arts in the fall. Amity Creative Theater's Kevin Durkee and Addie Robbins were chosen for our theater scholarship. Kevin, who wowed the audience as a sophomore in the title role of *Sweeney Todd*, will be joining the theater

The foundation is currently working with Amity faculty to craft a college scholarship opportunity in film for 2016.

Our legacy awards were designed to celebrate the places and experiences that had a significant impact on Jamie's development. Each of these awards is accompanied by a gift certificate or a cash award. At Racebrook School, the Jamie Hulley Creative Arts Award was presented to Jaclyn Nordyk. Amity Middle School's Jamie Hulley Art Award went to Elaina Ferraro who just two years before took home the Racebrook School award. Shelby Acampora was chosen for the Creative Spirit Award at Amity High School. And at the Lee Lund Dance Studio in Milford CT, the Jamie Hulley Intro to Performing Workshop Award was shared by five talented young dancers, Stephanie Caron, Caroline Chen, Melissa Heiter, Mia Kiska & Alaina McCarvill.

At Wesleyan University \$500 stipends are awarded to help defray the costs of two activities that Jamie never seemed to have enough money for ... art supplies and travel. This year two Senior Art Thesis Stipends were awarded to Concord NH native Sarah Koppelkam & Joseph Stella
