Word of our arts mini-grants for schools is spreading! What started out as a pilot program offered only to schools in the Bethany-Orange-Woodbridge, CT has expanded to include any school in the greater New Haven and Fairfield counties. Since the grants program's inception in 2007, 35 grants, ranging from \$1,000 to \$1,500 have been awarded local elementary, middle, and high schools with the goal of enhancing the standard curriculum through the integration of the arts. Our influence has been felt in Ansonia, Bethany, Derby, East Haven, New Haven, North Haven, Orange, and Woodbridge. Because one of the grant priorities is to bring working artists from the community into the schools to share their expertise with teachers and students, these grants are a win-win situation for the arts in Connecticut. Literally, thousands of students have been introduced to new and exciting facets of the artistic experience while, at the same time, the careers of scores of working studio artists, musicians, writers, poets, actors, dancers, sculptors, puppeteers, etc. have been supported by the visiting artist consulting positions these art grants make available. 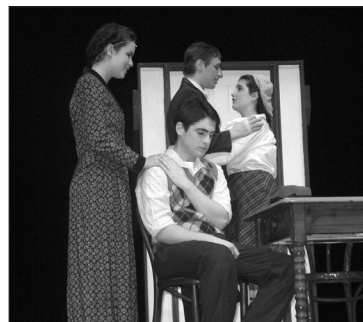
New Ventures & Old Friends

This year we are happy to announce a new partnership developed through one of our community grants with the Boys & Girls Club of Milford CT. With our funding, the Boys & Girls Club was able to offer a 10-week afterschool art program to 20 children in two age groups of age 11 and under and age 12 and above. Art teacher Brittany Ciecierski provided lessons in an array of mediums exploring themes of A-Symmetrical & Symmetrical Design, Self Portraits, Mosaic Art, Collage, Day of the Dead masks and Cartoon Drawing, just to name a few. The children will share their creations and their burgeoning talents with parents, Board members and the local community in a gallery exhibit on May 13, 2010.

Jamie's Race Brook Legacy

In a junior high school essay, Jamie wrote that she wanted to be a famous artist; she wanted everybody to know her name. To some degree, that wish has come true at her elementary school alma mater, Race Brook School in Orange CT. Ms Janet Greenspan was Jamie's 3rd grade teacher. Each year in the beginning of January, it has become a tradition for Jamie's mom Judy to bring in a collection of Jamie's artwork to share with Ms Greenspan's students. The children are always bubbling over with questions, "what was her favorite kind of art to do when she was my age?...what was she thinking when she painted that picture?...what do you think she would be painting if she were here today?" revel in the fact that a piece of artwork can mean different things to different people and they often use her artwork as prompts for their creative writing assignments. One of the children's favorite pieces is an intricately detailed pen & ink cartoon of the Orange Country Fair depicting a wide array of fair activities such as the grease pole, the snake exhibit, the fried dough stand, and a collection of goats, chickens and other assorted livestock. The children requested that a copy of the print be hung in the school lobby. And that is just where it now hangs for all to see.

A multicolored ebay Giving Works ribbon will be displayed on your ebay listing for potential buyers to see that you support our nonprofit organization. This can be a great advantage to you because items associated with the charity ribbon generate increased buyer confidence and greater revenues.



Here is what veteran ebay seller Debbie M. from Westfield Massachusetts has to say, "I have sold on ebay for years and I am sure that my sales have increased about 25% because of my affiliation with the Jamie Hulley Arts Foundation. So many of my buyers comment about wanting to support the arts through the foundation or ask for more information about the foundation. I believe that in spite of the current economic situation, we are still a nation of generous individuals who know how important small donations can be and how quickly those small donations can add up to sizeable amounts. As for me, I like the fact that once I designate the percentage I am donating when I list an item, there is nothing else for me to do. ebay does the rest automatically. The donations are deducted directly from my final value price and I receive periodic documentation for income tax purposes. ebay even provides a discount on seller fees as an incentive! I like the fact that I am helping a more personal foundation where I know that every penny is used for scholarships and grants rather than giving to an enormous national charity with large overhead costs."
